On offense, Millner showed very good hands and an ability to run after the catch. His blocking was very good and he showed an ability to get out in front of the blocks to get into position quickly. On defense, his effort dropped off. He was seen giving up on plays not run to his side. He also showed a lack of effort on plays that were run to his side. He would get himself into good position on run defense, but did not always make the play.

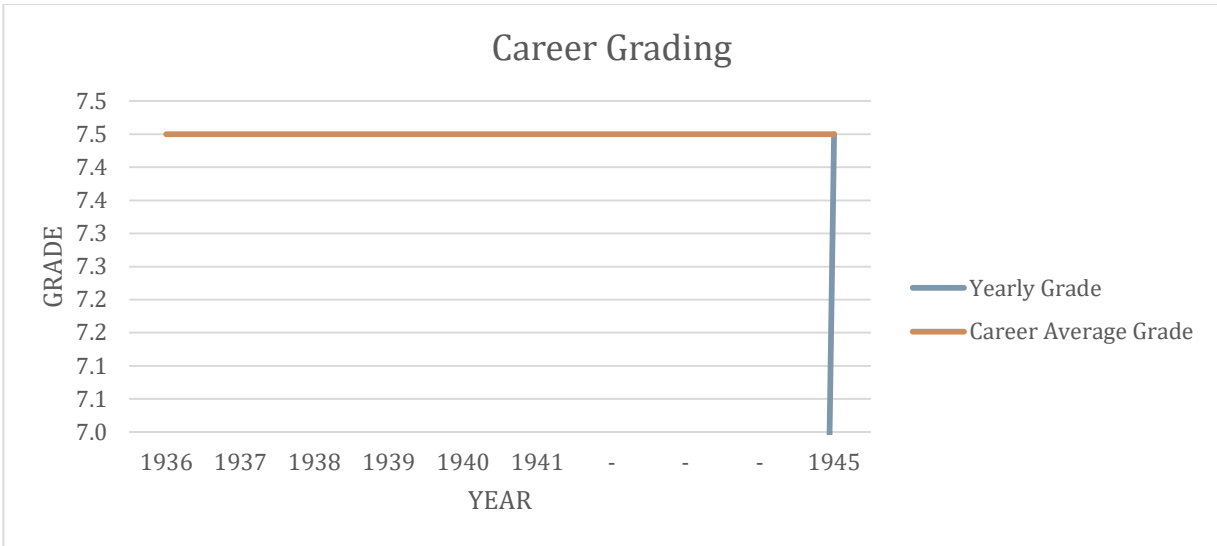

#### BOTTOM LINE

This was a short film. Millner played left offensive end and left defensive end in the game. On offense, the film showed one target. Millner caught the ball and had a good gain after the catch. On defense, he was able to get good penetration into the backfield on the pass rush. The offensive line did not do much to block him, so he was able to shed the blocks easily.

OFFENSE: On the second offensive series, Millner pulled right and caught a short pass. The pass was a little high, but he pulled it down and had a nice gain after the catch. Very good hands and concentration.

DEFENSE: On the first defensive play of the game, Millner fell on a fumble behind the line.

#### BOTTOM LINE

This was a short film. Millner played left offensive end, right offensive end and left defensive end. Field conditions were tough. There were not enough plays to give him an accurate grade. However, of the plays shown, he had an excellent game.

OFFENSE: Millner caught two passes for touchdowns: a 55-yard pass and a 78-yard pass. In both cases, he outran the defenders. He also made a key block on the Cliff Battles touchdown in the first quarter.

### BOTTOM LINE

This film was incomplete and had plays missing. Also, the blurriness of the film made it difficult to see player numbers. As a result, no grade was given.

OFFENSE: Millner had a pass hit his hands, which would have been an easy touchdown. He beat his defender and he had nobody between him and the end zone. He dropped the ball.

### BOTTOM LINE

Millner did not start the game. Tom Miller (#14) played the bulk of the snaps, as Millner was in and out of the game. He first appeared later in the first quarter on defense. He played left offensive end and left defensive end in the game. On special teams, he had several missed tackles. On defense, Miller was slow off the ball and showed little effort. He made a few plays, but not enough to make up for the lack of effort that cost the team a touchdown. On offense, he showed good hands. His route running could be a little sloppy and he did not put effort into plays that were not run to his side.

OFFENSE: On his first offensive play, he made a good block on Hal Robl (#20) help spring Wilbur Moore (#35) for a 47-yard touchdown. Miller sealed the outside and slowed down Robl enough to allow Moore to go outside. At that point, Moore outran the defenders on his way to the end zone. In the third quarter, Millner caught an eight-yard pass. Very little run after the catch as the defender hit him quickly. A few plays later, Millner caught a quick out, turned up the sideline (almost tip-toeing out of bounds), and took it up the sideline for a very good gain. Two plays later, he caught another quick out for a seven-yard gain. Both of these quick outs set up a double move, but Millner fell, forcing the quarterback to hold on to the ball and eventually get sacked.

DEFENSE: On his first noticeable play, there was a bad handoff to Bus Mertes (#51). He struggled to run to the outside and Millner tackled him for a large loss. Millner did a very good job to stay in his lane and to catch the play as it came to him. At the beginning of the third quarter, Millner ran right past Frank Seno (#45), who took the ball for a 47-yard touchdown run. Very little effort on the part of Millner.

### BOTTOM LINE

Millner played left offensive end, split end and left defensive end in the game. On defense, he was able to get very good pressure on the passer. He made good decisions against the run, but did not always make the play. However, he did have good position on the plays. The camera angles made it difficult to see his route-running abilities on offense. Blocking on offense was very good.

**OFFENSE:** On the second play of the game, Millner did a very good job blocking Steve Pritko (#30) on a run. On the next offensive series, Millner was targeted, but the pass was well away from Millner.

**DEFENSE:** On the first defensive series, Millner took on the pulling guard Mike Lazetich (#27). He shed the block of Lazetich to go after the runner, Fred Gehrke (#18). Millner went high on the tackle, which allowed Gehrke to power through and elude Millner. Great job at the beginning of the play, but poor effort at the end. A few plays later, he took on fullback Don Greenwood (#66). Millner hit and bounced off Greenwood, before chasing after Gehrke to tackle him for a loss. Excellent defensive play by Millner. Millner was able to get very good pressure on the passer.
